Super School Savers Scheme

Meet the Teacher and Parents Evenings

We will be holding an informal drop-in meeting for Reception to Year 6 parents on **Thursday 19th September 3.45 - 4.30pm**. This is an ideal opportunity for you to come along to meet your child's teacher, see their classroom and hear about classroom routines and curriculum plans. We hope you can join us.

A class newsletter will also be sent home on **Friday 13th September**, providing an overview of the year ahead together with your teachers' expectations.

Parents Evenings will be held on Wednesday 16th and Thursday 17th October 3.30-6.00pm. We politely ask that if you do bring your child that you take responsibility for their supervision as there will be no staff on the yard during this time. There will also be no clubs that week.

'Funky Friday' for KS2 pupils

Our popular enrichment curriculum programme, previously referred to as 'Wacky Wednesday', will now take place on Friday afternoons for KS2 pupils (Y3-6). Foundation Phase pupils will continue to work collaboratively and use the outdoors for rich learning experiences, as this is already embedded in good Foundation Phase practice. Following an evaluation of last year's provision, we will be running the programme over a 4 week period each half term, starting 27th September. Pupils will then rotate round the following 6 groups each half term: Yoga and mindfulness, STEM, Music Mayhem, Master Chefs, Wilderness Warriors and International Languages through Sport/

Attendance Matters – Every School Day Counts

As you may be aware, all schools are continually monitored on their pupil attendance - our attendance figure for last year was **95.4%.** We appreciate how hard it is for children to achieve 100% attendance due to widespread seasonal bugs and illnesses and this is why we celebrate pupils who achieve an attendance over 97% at the end of the summer term.

Lateness is also closely monitored by both the school and Education Welfare Officer. If you are experiencing difficulties, for whatever reason, in ensuring you child comes to school on time, please contact the school office to discuss how we may help.

Our target next year is 95.9%; please support us in achieving very good levels of attendance.



Engagement and Pupil Voice – The Llansannor School Senedd

Pupils' opinions and ideas in key parts of school life are very important to us and we are committed to developing their role in the school improvement process. We are continuing to operate a School Senedd which enables every pupil from Year 2-6 to be involved in an area of the school's work and to have a voice, make decisions and evaluate impact. We currently operate the following councils: Learning Ambassadors, Language Ambassadors including 'Criw Cymraeg', Playground Pals, Eco Council, Digital Leaders, Health and Wellbeing Group and Worship Leaders.

Each group has devised its own Mission Statement and is creating its own Action Plan. Staff are teaching pupils to take responsibility, through chairing and minute taking and reviewing actions. They have also elected their own Chair and Vice Chair persons to lead their group's work. The Chair and Vice Chair from each group make up the school's Senedd who will regularly meet with the Headteacher to discuss their work and plans.

School Uniform

It has been very pleasing to see how smart pupils look since their return in their school uniform; they clearly take pride in their appearance. If you would like to donate any outgrown uniform to school, we would be happy to receive it and recycle items.

We also ask that the children are dressed appropriately for PE and sport, wearing white T-shirts and navy or black shorts. Tracksuits and hoodies are advisable in colder weather.

We are a Healthy School

We continue to promote healthy eating and healthy lifestyles during the school day and we have achieved phase 1-5 of the Healthy Schools Programme for schools.

Please can you support us by providing children with a healthy snack and a healthy lunch box if your child chooses to have packed lunch (referred to as *brechdannau*).

Fizzy drinks, sweets, chocolate, crisps and sugary treats are not permitted during the school day. Our healthy school tuck shop offers fruit snacks and is available during morning play.
