Perhaps you could try one of Roald Dahl's revolting recipes?</p>	<p>Set up a melting experiment. Take three glasses and fill them with the same number of ice cubes. Put them in different places and see which melts first. Record your findings using words and pictures (or maybe photographs).</p>
<p>In the bath, use a measuring jug to measure different amounts of water.</p>	<p>Blow bubbles and explore the different colours you can see in them.</p>	<p>Compare how long it takes for a sugar lump to dissolve in warm and cold water. How can you record your findings?</p>	<p>Chalk some patterns on the ground.</p>	<p>Lie back and see what shapes you can see in the clouds, then draw what you see.</p>
<p>Fill an empty washing-up liquid bottle up with water and write words on the ground.</p>	<p>Fill some water balloons and throw them at a wall. Look at the strange patterns they make!</p>	<p>Make a collage out of tissue paper and hang it in the garden so that the sun can shine through it.</p>	<p>When the sun is shining, use the mist from a garden hose to make a rainbow.</p>	<p>Use large sheets of paper, an old pair of shoes and some paint to make some footprint art.</p>
